### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S PEN

Another golfing month passes, a little wet weather but the rain has been great for the course. I have never seen it looking better. Great work from our dedicated green keepers and volunteers. Presentation for the Vets and the Club Championship is outstanding.(pity my golf hasn't been up to scratch).

Our new website is up and running it shows our course at its full potential with our Facebook page. The designer Jen Mulligan Design has completed a fabulous job. The hole by hole flyovers are just great. Please Members spend some time and go through it. It shows what a great course we have.

The new interface with Micropower is also excellent.

We have almost got to a point where we are happy. It has been a long hard struggle with them.

The Committee has set aside money from the sinking fund for drainage works on holes 4 & 5. These are the holes now that will close the course in wet weather particularly for motorised buggies. It is imperative that at all possible times motorised buggies are able to be used. This work will commence once legal arrangements are completed with Kerry Campbell for water to discharge into his dam at the back of the 4 hole.

Kerry & Sharon long term and respected members of our club have graciously allowed the access at no cost. They are great supporters of the Hervey Bay Golf Club. I, on behalf of the Members, say thank you to you both.

I have renegotiated the recycled water agreement with Wide Bay Water. We now have an agreement for the next five years @ \$35.00 a megalitre. Our irrigation is extremely important us and to Wide Bay Water. As we are a large use customer because we pump at our cost from their dam, they reduced the cost from \$70.00. To give you some perspective we use approx in the dry season, 1.5 meg a night.

Sandra Kerley and myself attended the Golf Wide Bay AGM. This was a busy meeting pertaining to costs, pennants, coordination of all things golf in our zone, plus a report from Queensland Golf. Sandra is working in our best interest here, thank you.

Preparation for next years budget is well underway. The Committee adopted a new scale of charges for the coming year. There will be a rise across the board of CPI 1.5%. This is in line with the Constitution. I have attached the fee scale FYI.

### **CAPTAINS REPORT**

As I formulate this piece, the weather is perfect for golf. Sunny days following on from steady tolerable rain, little wind and the course looking great! With the Men's Championships underway and the Ladies from the 22<sup>nd</sup> May an important month or two for keen golfers of both sexes. All the usual reminders that unfortunately must be spoken of including raking bunkers, fixing divots and plug marks are all still, or should be 'top of mind'.

I have another unpleasant concern brought to my attention by various people though, concerning some of our male members choosing to use the cover of the botanical areas of the course to action the practice of reducing the content of their bladder! Of particular note is that some offenders (usually the same people) are choosing to perform this act between the first tee block and the ninth green! Not only is this practice intolerable, rude and offensive, it displays a distinct lack of respect for other club members. With the toilets only less than 100 metres away and others on the course, these grubs are advised to desist from this "habit" immediately. If you haven't seen it yet, have a look at the Drone flyovers of each hole and a lot of the new content, bearing in mind that we spent more time in providing more detailed content of interest to the general public, including our newsletters. Follow the usual steps to get to the MPower site for the members portal. Course changes, weather closures and restrictions and other information is going to be available a lot quicker on the site too.

We are finalising the new Programme of Events from July to January at the moment. This will be released in June.

### GREENS AND FORWARD PLANNING REPORT

Dear Members, please find the April update from the Greens and Forward Planning Committee.

As previously informed in the March update, both committees have continued with developing course improvement initiatives. This includes a list of projects to be rolled out over the coming months. The top three are listed accordingly;

- 1. Widening of the 16<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> greens
- 2. Upgrade of bunker drainage at the 4<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> holes
- 3. Continuous replacement of sprinkler heads and isolation valves in the irrigation system.

The greens widening has now started with the 16<sup>th</sup> being completed in the past 2 weeks. Members are to ensure the GUR rules are applied as the widening works settle and take hold. The committee would like to thank the members for their understanding during the club championships of the temporary rule. By all reports, the 16<sup>th</sup> green is performing well and will only get better. Work on the 4<sup>th</sup> green will be programmed after the club championships.

The bunker drainage will commence as the month of May progresses. Members are expected to not be impacted as these works progress however, there may, at times be bunkers out of play during the upgrade period. Upgrades are proposed to commence after the club championship. Works will include the removal of the sand, shaping of the bunker profile, installation of special drainage units and outlet lines. The project will be undertaken by the greens staff to keep costs down. This method of rectification is working successfully on other bunkers on the course and is proving to be effective.

I am still waiting for feedback from the members on the performance of the mechanical bunker rake and trenching attachment to the Ventrac multipurpose machine. It is my understanding that the rake is allowing the bunker profile to be deeper and more consistent. I assume if I get no complaints, then the new equipment is doing a great job.

The irrigation valves replacements are progressively being delivered under the direction of the Greens Superintendent. Members may notice this occurring on the course and should be wary of the work areas when playing.

Other projects outside of the continuous course maintenance program that are sitting for budget approval include;

Installation of the drainage system for the 4<sup>th</sup> hole Progressive installation of cart paths throughout the course Additional irrigation pump for the reuse water supply Reserve irrigation pump for the water distribution system



The drainage of the 4<sup>th</sup> hole is being developed and construction plans are underway. Once the plans are drafted, the committee will be able to obtained firm quotes and arrange funding in the forward budget. This project is one that will improve the course resilience and limit the closure of the 4<sup>th</sup> hole when we get excessive rain. With the implementation of a drainage system similar to that placed on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> holes, the fairway will dry out quicker and allow motorised carts back on the course after heavy rain events. In the long run this means we get to play more golf and accordingly loss of our revenue due to course closure stream will be reduced.

Again, I still remind members to look after our most valuable asset by being vigilant with course care, divot filling, pitch mark repairing, and bunker raking. This is particularly so during the club championships, but also throughout the year.

Members, if you wish to offer a suggestion please put it in writing and drop it in at the office or use the suggestion box provided. Alternatively, you can email the club through the secretary or reception addresses. The committee is more than happy to receive your comments and review them constructively for consideration.

A always, I look forward to receiving your written suggestions put forward on how we can further improve the course and keep our club progressing.
