Good to see a couple of new names getting amongst it. All winners received varying cash amounts added to their house account. The credits can be used at The Clubhouse, Pro Shop and to offset against your upcoming Subscriptions in June. Our thanks again to Sponsors Wide Bay Mazda, they are also sponsoring the Ladies Championships that commenced with their first round on the 22nd May. A big thank you to them! They intend to have cars on course during the event and attend the presentation of prizes.

The next big event on our calendar (despite not being physically listed in the book) is the Wide Bay Open & Closed Championships on the weekend of 15th & 16th June. Our local "House of Golf (inc Pro Shop") are sponsoring the event that has some basic conditions attached to it.

 \cdot Two-day entry fee of \$50 payable on Saturday. It is a 36-hole event only with no single day prizes.

• Entry fee includes pin shots and a light lunch each day. (Hamburger Bar)

 \cdot Single day players (\$25) are not eligible for Championship event. However, they are eligible for daily Pin Shot prizes.

 \cdot Nominations; Preference will be given to players electing to play both days in this Championship event.

As we can only have a limited field in the Shotgun starts at 7am & Noon, your nomination goes into a draw for a place in the final field. Drawn on Wednesday 12th June.

July also a big event month with the "Legends Pro Am" being conducted 19th to 21st July. The Pro-Am organisers Jenny Davies and Gerry Taylor (also Shaun Edward & Chris Mizzi I believe) have put together a fantastic variety of attractions and highlights to make this, in my opinion, the best ever event of its kind here at HBGC. I won't steal their thunder, keep your ears and eyes open and make sure you note the dates down in your diary/phone/calendar, etc. Something for everybody, day & night!!!

You may have noticed some new Drop Zones near the GUR gardens behind the 11th Green. Thanks to Doerte Hecker, who brought this to my attention via the Suggestion Box. For those who for whatever reason, find themselves landing a ball in that GUR garden you have to use one of the two Drop Zone boxes dependent on where your ball is located in the garden. Follow the blue paint and the location of the blue stake in the middle. No more guessing.

The Temporary Local Rule regarding the free placement of your ball if it is located in the furrow on the edge of the green is being abused by some people. The rule specifically says the "furrow" (small trench or groove). So, unless there is a definite furrow, no relief is available. To merely come to rest on the edge of the green without the furrow does not comply and the ball can be marked and cleaned but must be replaced exactly where it came from as anywhere else on the green.

I would like to thank Matt in the Pro-Shop for his extra work involved in getting all these special events sorted out in the MPower computer system. The two Championships, the upcoming Wide Bay Open, the Pro Am, etc. He says as long as the system doesn't crash (has happened on several occasions) all should go to plan. The Wide Bay Open is held over two days with 7am & noon Shotgun starts, so expect a few delays whilst card printing, etc is underway. No doubt Gerry, Chris and maybe Shane might assist too. Good luck fellas.

At the last Management Meeting we passed a resolution to allow current and ex Defence Force personnel to play free on each Labour Day and Remembrance Day. More details as the next of those days is upon us. It happens to be a Monday, so I will discuss final details with the Vets Committee as it draws closer.

Another big Club event happens in June, Sunday the 23rd in fact, THE IAN GLAISTER FLOORING MIXED FOURESOMES. So, grab a partner to be part of this honour board 27-hole event that always draws a big field.

*These cart restrictions (first para) are always advised on the score cards, and I believe the Vets committee make these restrictions known to their group verbally as well. As indicated previously, offenders found driving their carts on "closed fairways" can be disqualified. One such Vet was disqualified recently for blatantly dis-obeying this temporary rule. Remember the reasons for these rules, they are there to protect the course and doing whatever we can to allow members to use their carts as much as possible. Be aware!

Remember, we are a Ready Golf Club, hit when ready, as long as it's safe to do so!

Finally, "Golf; It's only a game, enjoy it and let everybody else do the same!"

GREENS AND FORWARD PLANNING REPORT

Dear Members, please find the May update from the Greens and Forward Planning Committee.

Last update I reminded members of the projects being planned for future works on the course. As highlighted, the 16th green expansion has now been completed and starting to take shape. On top of that works, comes the next phase which is the 4th hole,

This project has been continuously reported since I began my role as the Green's Chairman and has developed into a resilience initiative. I am pleased to announce that we have developed the proposed drainage plans and are now in quotation stage. The works will comprise of the following;

1. Installation of an underground pipe system with grated surface inlet pits to drain surface and subsurface stormwater to a discharge point downstream of the course. Approx 350 metres of pipe along the left-hand side of the fairway;

2. Installation of approximately 700 metres of lateral subsurface drainage (agricultural lines) to drain saturated soil to the underground pipe system;

3. Installation of "end of line" flushing points to the subsurface drainage for future maintenance access;

4. Construction of an overland collection swale along the left-hand side of the fairway over the pipes system and then crossing the front of the 4th green to join the existing overland flow channel;

5. Lowering of the pipe culvert crossing at the right-hand side of the 4th green;

6. Reshaping and cleaning out of the open drain from the right hand side of the 4th green to the Hythe Street road reserve at the northern boundary of the golf course property.

Members, this major project aligns with the journey we undertook at the beginning of 2018 to make our course resilient to stormwater and flooding. In particular, the work is to allow the 4th fairway to recover from storm events quickly so we can get motorised carts back on the lower areas of the course earlier. It is envisaged that once this work is complete, we can begin to look at the expansion of the 4th green as part of the long-term revamp of the hole.

The bunker drainage is continuing and progressing. Once again members are expected to not be impacted as these works progress however, there may, at times be bunkers out of play during the upgrade period. The greens staff will be carrying out the project to keep costs down. This method of rectification is working successfully on other bunkers on the course and is proving to be effective.

The irrigation valves replacements are progressively being delivered under the direction of the Greens Superintendent with zone 1 of the 3 zones nearly complete. Members may notice this occurring on the course and should be wary of the work areas when playing.

Other smaller projects recently installed include new ball washers at the 4th, 12th and eventually the 17th holes. These compliment the ball washers already in place and allow obsessive members who like a clean golf ball (like me) to be content. Expansion of the turf nursery at the 14th tee and progressive cutting down of the rough around the 6th, 10th and 17th greens will develop over the coming months.

Other projects progressing to budget consideration include;

- · Progressive installation of cart paths throughout the course;
- · Additional irrigation pump for the reuse water supply;
- Reserve irrigation pump for the water distribution system;

- Expansion of the 4th green;
- Installation of steps to some tees for improved access.

Recently the management committee endorsed the 2019/2020 budget, which includes the progressive renewal of the green's fairway mowers. These are one of our most expensive but essential equipment needs and I am happy to advise that our repair to equipment costs have reduced, surface conditions continue to improve and cutting efficiency is up. I am especially grateful to the members who have weathered the fee increases to allow this equipment replacement, irrigation replacement and overall asset management plan to develop.

Members, if you wish to offer a suggestion please put it in writing and drop it in at the office or use the suggestion box provided. Alternatively, you can email the club through the secretary or reception addresses. The committee is more than happy to receive your comments and review them constructively for consideration.

Congratulation to our Greens Superintendent Peter Fraser, for being selected to participate as part of the greens staff for the Australian Open. This is a terrific opportunity for Peter to learn about course care at a major tournament and bring this knowledge back home. Congratulations also to the green team for their continued professionalism and dedication to the course. With the Wide Bay Open coming up I am sure the course will be brilliant and be a positive talking point to all who play.

As always, I look forward to receiving your written suggestions put forward on how we can further improve the course and keep our club progressing.

COURSE SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Members,

We have had some very welcome rain over the last 3 months with a total of 346mm recorded. With this rain and the program I have in place, the course has never looked better and grass coverage coming into winter is superb. We have a few projects coming up in the next couple of months which include:

- · Expanding the greens nursery beside the 14th tee
- \cdot Expanding yellow tee on 2 for more teeing options when it is a back pin
- \cdot Bunker drainage on 2 small bunkers on 8
- · Ball valve replacement on going

The 16th green is coming along nicely with it now being cut at 4mm, won't be too much longer and it will be in play. There is a new drop zone in place at the rear of the 11th green for those who go into the garden. We have finished shaving down the green surrounds and they are looking and playing a lot better; you now have more options around the greens and tie in nicely with the fairways.

We recently root pruned the right hand side of 15 and through winter we will be doing the rest of the problem areas. The ball valve replacement program is ongoing with 1 zone completed and zone 2 not far off. You may have noticed some new ball washers around the course and we have one more to fit at the 17th tee. The new ball washers come with towels provided and have recently noticed that 1 has already been taken. Please leave the towels attached to the ball washer. They are there to be used by all golfers and not to be taken for personal use. Thank you.
